Introducing our Eastern Washington Liaison, Sarah Hylton Koment

Hello C.O.P.S. family! My name is Sarah Hylton Koment and I am a surviving daughter of Deputy Christopher W. Hylton, Orange County (FL) S.O., E.O.W. 07/22/1996. Other surviving family members include my sister, Amy Hylton and Mother, Cindy Miller. I have been involved with the C.O.P.S. organization ever since my Dad's passing. During that time we were very much supported, and have continued to be supported throughout my adult life by officers who worked with my dad, as well as members of Concerns Of Police Survivors.

My dad was first a police officer in Mount Prospect, Illinois. My family moved to Deltona, Florida when I was five and my dad began his career with the Orange County Sheriff's Office. A drunk driver killed him as he headed to work when I was 12. Through the support of C.O.P.S. and my Orange County Sheriff's Office family, my sister and I were given financial assistance to attend and graduate from the University of Florida (GO GATORS!).

Through one of my sorority sisters, I met my now-husband Steven Koment. He is a 4 year Army Veteran and currently a United States Border Patrol Agent. While we were engaged, he was offered a job on the Northern Border in good ole' Oroville, Washington. He first worked at the Yuma, Arizona Station for 10 months and we moved to Oroville in October of 2010.

I began working as a Teller for Wells Fargo in February 2012, and was promoted to Service Manager in December 2013. Through my Management Role, I became very involved with volunteering and numerous non-profits. Through the help of my District Manager, I became aware of the Saul Gallegos Memorial Run in Chelan, Washington. I did some research and found out that the brunch after the run was sponsored by Washington State C.O.P.S. It was then that I was connected to our state's chapter.

Through my Wells Fargo career, I was nominated for a prestigious award and was lucky enough to become a 2016 Service Award Champion. I was able to attend a banquet in Seattle and had a chance to earn \$1,000 for a non-profit of my choice. I showed my passion for the C.O.P.S. Organization, shared my story, and was honored to win \$1,000! I worked with Brenda Donner and Ernie Barber to coordinate the donation, and through our corresponding, they mentioned that there was an opening for the Eastern Washington Liaison position. I was thrilled to hear, was interviewed, the board voted, and I jumped on the opportunity to be a part of the Washington State Concerns of Police Survivors!

Thank you for this amazing opportunity to serve as Eastern Washington Liaison, and I am so excited to be a part of something that is so near and dear to my heart.

Esteban Underwood's Graduation Surprise, by Rosathe Underwood

Ever since my husband, Des Moines Master Police Officer Steve Underwood, was murdered on March 7, 2001, each one of Esteban's celebrations, from birthdays to school plays, has been a painful reminder of his loss.

This year was no different. My heart sunk as our son's 2017 graduation date crept up.

Early spring 2017, I was contacted by one of the officers who worked with Steve. He asked if it was ok for him and a few officers from Des Moines PD to come to Esteban's graduation and fill Steve's empty seat. Quickly tears filled my eyes and of course I said yes as long as that was ok with Esteban. Esteban also thought it would be great to have the police family present on his graduation day. At that point we felt loved and were grateful to have a small group of Steve's buddies come and cheer Esteban as he reached such a big milestone.

Graduation day came and nothing could have prepared us for the love and support we received. According to the *Everett Herald*, 100 officers came to greet and clap for our son Esteban! Simply put, the presence of so many officers at Esteban's graduation changed a painful memory into a happy one. Before Esteban's graduation, we saw the gathering of officers as a way to honor a lost loved one. Now we can see it as a celebration of someone's accomplishments.

I will forever be grateful to those officers who came to cheer our son. They let him know that he matters. He now knows that there is a huge group of officers, at least 100, who care and want to see him succeed.

Rebecca lost the love of her life in November 2016. Tacoma Police Officer Jake Gutierrez was shot and killed while responding to a domestic violence call in Tacoma. Jake and Rebecca were just four days from being married.

Throughout the night, we educated people on what this great organization stands for, what they do and why we are here. We tell our story and share our special pictures of our fallen.

C.O.P.S provides the much needed comfort after the memorial, after everyone has gone back to their normal routine. As a survivor you do not have a normal routine. C.O.P.S. helps with much needed support. All of the wonderful retreats for kids, parents, spouses, significant others, adult children, co-workers and grandparents. Helping the families with National Police Week, WASateC.O.P.S. picnics, chapter meetings, special law enforcement appreciation nights in local communities and most important, you share a loss with many who understand and support you through your journey one day at a time.

We had an amazing time meeting great people, seeing beautiful costumes but most of all, being there to represent C.O.P.S and spreading the word of the great work they do.

We were honored to be able to attend and look forward to attending and representing WASateC.O.P.S. in 2018.
