Fiancées / Significant Others Retreat, by Heather Coleman, fiancée of Wapato PD Officer Derek “Chip” Hansen, EOW 03/08/2014

Chip’s EOW was March 8, 2014, and I finally had the opportunity to attend the C.O.P.S. virtual program for fiancées/significant others. Having never been able to travel to survivor camp, I wasn’t sure what to expect. What I experienced over two days of online interaction, was not simply a group of fellow survivors and counselors, but a genuine family who welcomed old and new members with equal love and support.

I really felt like the virtual format provided the perfect ice breaker for those of us who were new to the group. This introduction made longtime survivors who had never attended camp, as well as first year survivors, comfortable enough to join in discussions with members who were already super close with one another. By the final session we’d all learned each other’s names, faces, and stories by talking, crying, and laughing together online.



The sessions also allowed me to face grief in the most comfortable environment possible: at home. I’ve always been held to the expectation that you never show extreme emotion in public. Losing Chip drastically challenged my ability to meet this expectation because I couldn’t think clearly due to the overwhelming grief. My social skills were simply lost; I no longer knew how to talk or interact with others. Allowing the enormity of the situation to hit me in the privacy of my own home, enabled me to cry openly (as everyone did) and acknowledge grief I hadn’t yet begun to process. In addition to the fun, laughter, and general goofiness of our tightknit survivor group, the weekend provided me with new skills to assist in processing that grief as well as techniques to address other daily challenges in a positive and healthy manner.

I also didn’t fully grasp how beneficial it could be to connect with fellow survivors and learn from grief counselors. To know that my journey, challenges, and thoughts were entirely commonplace really helped me to better understand the grief process. We learned methods for developing a “new normal” from the counselors and shared methods that have worked for each of us along the way, allowing us the opportunity to both learn and to help one another.

I wholeheartedly recommend the virtual programs to everyone and hope they consider holding these virtual events at least quarterly in concert with the annual survivor camps. I see a significant benefit to regular interaction with the group, timely introductions for the newest survivors, and ongoing lessons and skills offered by the incredible counselors. My endless thanks goes out to WASateC.O.P.S and National C.O.P.S. organization for all they do to support every survivor.

Survivors of Blue Suicide, by Julie Zielinski, mother of Chelan County Deputy Matt Zielinski, EOW 06/01/2005



On June 1, 2005, I found myself lost and alone as a result of the suicide of my son, Matthew, a Sergeant in the United States Marine Corp and a Chelan County Sheriff deputy. Where do I go, what do I do went through my mind. The Sheriff's Department treated me with respect and love.

They lost a great deputy who was soon to be put on the SWAT team. I was introduced to Rhea Marshall from WASTateC.O.P.S. (*W, Officer Mike Marshall, Omak PD, EOW 03/26/1998*). She was so kind. She invited me to a chapter meeting where I shared my loneliness and some of the statements made by those who don't understand suicide survivors. Faith in the Lord carried me through those days but it was obvious that support was needed for law enforcement suicide survivors. A book followed (2012) along with many speaking engagements at service clubs, schools, churches, etc. Educating others about relating to suicide survivors and their needs became a focus. I was asked to be suicide liaison for WASTateC.O.P.S. What an honor!

In April 2020, I received a call from Laurie Putnam, National C.O.P.S. Director of Services and Outreach, asking if I would like to be on a new committee for suicide survivors. Shelley Jones, Founder and Executive Director of SBS, Laurie and a small group of us, started with the legal structure, such as mission and vision statements, by-laws and naming our organization which became Survivors of Blue Suicide or SBS.

I have been in touch with "my survivors" from C.O.P.S. and they think this organization will be awesome. I am so thankful for all of them. We (suicide survivors) are living a lonely life but now we have a group of people who have jumped on board and we can all help each other through these difficult times.

Suicide is extremely negative but NOW we have a chance to educate ALL our law enforcement officers through conferences and trainings. I served on the SBS founding committee and now am the NW Region liaison.

Many thanks to National C.O.P.S. for putting some seed money to get SBS started; we now support suicide survivors through various programming like retreats, modeled after those of National C.O.P.S.
